Dr. Babus performing New Treatment Options for Pain Patients

For many years James Criso suffered from knee pain. While the retired postal worker had discomfort in both knees, it was his left knee that really bothered him. He had a procedure in the 1970's and a series of treatments after but nothing worked successfully. Smoking a cigar at the store he managed in Staten Island, Mr. Criso reluctantly accepted that he was unlikely to ever have his pain relieved.

Enter **Dr. Glenn Babus** and the HCA Pain Management team. Last year Dr. Babus (right with Mr. Criso to his left) began performing **amniotic fluid injections**. Using fluid derived from donated human placental amnion fluid, the non-invasive procedure contains more than 100 growth factors and other nutrients. It encourages healing in cells and soft tissue without the risk of dangerous side effects. Dr. Babus offered the treatment to Mr. Criso in an attempt to finally fix his knee. Eager for any help he could get, Mr. Criso signed up, came into the office and had the injection. Fortunately, he felt almost immediate relief. He began walking better, felt more agile and is now thinking about having the injection performed on his other knee. 40 years after his initial procedure Mr. Criso said he finally feels relief. HCA offering Free Basic Life Support (BLS) Training Classes

In January we began offering free **BLS (Basic Life Support)** training classes to all HCA employees. The courses, valued at \$100, are being taught by certified instructors and HCA Physician Assistants **Michelle O. Twito**, **Michael S. Hood**, **Angela Grillo** and **Jillian Sarnelli**. All classes are being held upstairs at our **Imaging Center** at **65 Columbus Avenue**.

In order to be compliant with accreditation requirements, all clinical employees are required to complete the course and become certified or re-certified. Classes are currently being offered on a first come, first served basis with preference given to employees with patient contact. Copies of the individual certifications are required to be submitted to Human Resources by April 1. <u>Come in, Relax and Stand Up – Upgrading HCA's X-Ray Department</u> By Angelo Spatola, LRT

Here at Healthcare Associates in Medicine our orthopedic suites provide our patients the latest in radiological imaging. Specifically, our **Viztek U-Arm units** (right) allow patients to stand while having any body part imaged. It also permits the technician to position the patient in a more natural pose so that they may be comfortable for the exam. Fortunately, the days of asking a patient already suffering from pain to lie on a cold, hard table are over.

Our new and advanced filtration system allows for minimum radiation doses while providing maximum image quality. This is completed through our new digital system. Previously, using conventional radiology, it could take up to 90 seconds to produce one image. In computerized radiology it could take around a minute to produce the same image. In 2016, however, our digital Viztek unit produces an image in seven or eight seconds. Patients can now expect their wait time to be significantly reduced from what it was even just a few short years ago.

Our equipment is capable of producing specialty orthopedic views that aid our surgeons in treatment, surgical planning and post-operative care. We have two adjacent X-Ray rooms, each capable of producing more than 15 studies per hour. We are equipped to handle a wide variety of patients from pediatric to geriatric and special needs. Patients with new injuries can come in without an appointment to our walk-in department. This facility allows patients to be seen, examined, X-rayed and treated all in one location. HCA's board-certified physicians are also available for consultation or additional treatments. The X-Ray department is currently located on the second floor at **3333 Hylan Boulevard**. Dr. Grossman providing New Options for Orthopedic Patients

HCA orthopedic physician **Dr. Lauren B. Grossman** is now offering new treatment options for orthopedic patients. Specifically, Dr. Grossman is performing **Platelet Rich Plasma (PRP) injections** for patients suffering from a variety of orthopedic ailments. PRP therapy, which takes around 20 minutes to complete, starts with a small withdrawal of the patient's blood. The sample is then placed in a centrifuge to separate the platelet-rich plasma from the other components of whole blood. The concentrated platelets are then injected into the site of the injury. The platelets function as a natural reservoir for growth factors that are essential to repair injured tissue.

"This is great as a non-surgical option," said Dr. Grossman. "You heal faster naturally by using your own body cells. The patients I've performed this on have done really well and are feeling better." To date, the physician has found particular success with those suffering from "tennis elbow" (inflammation of the tendons of the elbow due to overuse of the forearm muscles). Typically three injections are performed one week apart in order to maximize the effectiveness.
